Final Project - Create a Series Trailer

Purpose:

This assignment is designed to serve as a culminating project where students will demonstrate their understanding of all course material as well as use creativity to design original content. Students will also work with others to reach a common goal. This project aligns with GenEd goals, which ask that students:

- Think critically.
- Communicate effectively orally and in writing including with group members and audiences.
- Apply multiple perspectives, paradigms, and frameworks to problems, topics, or issues
- Describe or evaluate a work of art or creative process using appropriate terminology.

Overview:

- In groups of 3-6 people, students will create the outline for a brand new television series as well as a trailer for that series.
- Students may select their own groups for this assignment
- Design a new series with your team. The series should stand for something important. We have investigated a variety of shows from different eras as well as modern representations of identity. What do you want to contribute to the way modern television represents different identities? Who do you want to represent and how do you want to represent them?

Trailer Explanation – 55 Points Due 12/16 by Noon

Overview:

Although the final portion of the project is due after the actual trailer, I expect you to complete this information prior to completing the trailer. Completing this information will provide you with a guide when creating your trailer. I want you to make creative choices with purpose and intent and after having reflected on course material.

Instructions:

Complete all the information listed below. See the project template for formatting information and more details.

- Introduce the main characters why did you choose to introduce them in this way?
- Introduce at least 1 of the conflicts why did you choose to introduce the conflict(s) in this way?
- Introduce at least 1 of the themes why did you choose to introduce the theme(s) in this way?
- Deliberate use of music of silence what mood or tone does your choice cultivate and why did you make this choice?
- Deliberate use of a symbol/color What effect were you trying to produce with this symbol/color?
- 1 close up shot what effect were you trying to produce with this close up?
- 1 show that includes a deliberate choice of background what effect were you trying to produce with this choice of background?
- 1 shot from an unusual angle what effect were you trying to produce with this camera angle?
- 1 shot with 2 or more characters interacting why did you select these characters to interact? What effect were you trying to produce through this interaction?

Overview:

Trailer – 80 Points Due 12/13 by 6:00am

Overview:

The trailer you create for your series should provide a clear and coherent overview of the series you have designed. This is an opportunity for you to think about how you want to contribute to television media. What do you want to say and how do you want to say it? Who do you want to represent and how? What narrative do you want to tell? Whose story do you want to share? Use your creativity to create something new and intriguing.

Instructions:

- Your trailer should adhere to the following criteria:
 - \circ 1 minute 30 seconds 2 minutes 30 seconds in length
 - Filmed on a smartphone
 - Can be edited with the software of your choosing
- The trailer must:
 - 1. Introduce the show clearly
 - 2. Reflect the overall tone or mood of the show
 - 3. Introduce the main characters
 - 4. Introduce at least 1 of the conflicts
 - 5. Introduce at least 1 of the themes
- Stylistic Choices must include:
 - 6. Deliberate use of music or silence
 - 7. Deliberate use of a symbol or color
 - 8. 1 close up shot
 - 9. 1 shot that includes a deliberate choice of background
 - 10. 1 shot from an unusual angle
 - 11. 1 shot with two or more characters interacting
- YouTube
 - In the description section, please list each item (3-11 in the list above) and the time in which that item appears in the video.
 - Doing this should link those items so I can click on the time and be taken directly to that portion of your video

- We will screen all trailers in class
- Please prepare a 30 second description of your series your group will stand in front of the class and provide this description prior to watching.
